He also brought a few 26 27

comments from Mayor Shoji who couldn't attend:

- Finance Plan Stabilization, Methodology with MOU use
- North Bend Include their facilities as they would also be assets
- Master Park Plan Trails Plan Management needs to be a plan of its own. Connectivity with Downtown Trails and River Walk. A plan showing how to lead the people to the next amenity or trail. Roads are included in connectivity.

Randy began with the table of contents of the Parks Master Plan. He summarized each of the eight chapters asking for any questions as he proceeded. (See audio recording for complete detail) During the course of discussion, Randy emphasized the point of taking advantage of sharing the existing acreages rather than the City trying to acquire 1200 acres. It is not unrealistic to enter into MOUs to bring all of North Bend, Coos Bay and Coos County collectively as a group partnership for use of facilities.

- using MOUs. She was also concerned if considering design and safety guidelines. How do you 40
- incorporate both? How close are we? 41

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- 42 There is an identified need for a need of a multi-sport/activity complex as well as a dog park.
- Dog parks do require special development plans. During the time of design, you want to include 43
- everything and incorporate in your Master Plan, even if in a phase-in development. 14
