

**HEREAS**, the Zonta Club of the Coos Bay Area, having been in continuous existence since 1953, is a member of Zonta International, District 8, recognizes the crime of violence against women and girls:

- · continues to be the most pervasive human rights violation and a global epidemic, and
- is due to systemic use of physical, emotional, verbal, sexual, psychological, and economic control and/or abuse, and
- does not know any national nor cultural barriers, affecting millions of women and girls of all races and socioeconomic backgrounds, in peacetime and conflict, and
- · violates an individual's privacy, dignity, security, and humanity, and
- results in serious short-term and long-term physical, sexual, reproductive, and mental health problems; and

##HEREAS, the World Health Organization estimates one in three or 30% of all women worldwide have experienced physical and/or sexual violence; and

**##HEREAS**, according to UNICEF "around 120 million girls under the age of 20 worldwide (about one in 10) have experienced forced intercourse or other forced sexual acts"; and

##HEREAS, more than 650 million women alive today were married as children and 12 million girls are married before the age of 18 each year; and

**HEREAS**, according to the Global Report on Trafficking in Persons by the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime "the most common form of human trafficking (79%) is sexual exploitation"; and

##HEREAS, Zonta International is a leading global organization of professionals with more than 26,000 members in 62 countries working together to make gender equality a worldwide reality for women and girls and has contributed to help achieve a world free of violence against women and girls for more than 100 years; and

HEREAS, during the 16 Days of Activism, 25 November-10 December, the Zonta Club of the Coos Bay Area along with all Zonta clubs, is encouraged to take part in the Zonta Says NO to Violence Against Women campaign and to take local, national, and international actions to influence the making and implementation of laws, as well as changing gender-based attitudes and behaviors to end violence against women; and
