A Partnership between Coos County, and the Cities of Coos Bay and North Bend

At a glance

Coos County and the Cities of Coos Bay and North Bend have received a grant from the State of Oregon to strengthen the county's response to homelessness. Over the next two years, this pilot project will support coordination, accessing additional resources, and creating a better system for residents experiencing homelessness to access services.

HB 4123

This pilot program was established by Oregon House Bill 4123 which created eight pilot programs across the State. Each pilot program will receive \$1 Million in state funding over two years to coordinate efforts.

City-County Coordinated Strategic Plan

Coos County and the Cities of Coos Bay and North Bend are working with stakeholders to understand how our community can respond better to the housing crisis affecting our neighbors through interviews, surveys, and meetings. This process will inform a five-year strategic continuum of care (CoC) plan. By May 2023, the plan must be completed and adopted by the three partner agencies in order to allocate the grant dollars.
