HEREAS, trees can reduce the erosion of our precious topsoil by wind and water, cut heating, and cooling costs, moderate the temperature, clean the air, produce oxygen, and provide habitat for wildlife, and

BHEREAS, trees are a renewable resource giving us paper, wood for our homes, fuel for our fires, and countless other wood products, and

BHEREAS, trees in our city increase property values, enhance the economic vitality of business areas, and beautify our community, and

WHEREAS, Coos Bay has been recognized as a Tree City USA by the National Arbor Day Foundation, and desires to continue its tree-planting endeavors, and

BHEREAS, trees are a source of joy and spiritual renewal, and

DOW, THEREFORE, I, Joe Benetti, Mayor of the City of Coos Bay, do hereby proclaim that the last Friday in April, from this time forward, shall be observed as

ARBOR DAY

in the City of Coos Bay, and I urge all citizens to support efforts to care for our trees and woodlands, and to support our City's community forestry program, and

JURTHER, I urge all citizens to plant trees to gladden the hearts and promote the well-being of present and future generations.
