## *Happening This Weekend!!!*

### City Clean Up Day (Coos Bay and North Bend):

The annual City Clean Up Day is scheduled for tomorrow, April 22<sup>nd</sup> from 10am to 3pm. Residents of Coos Bay and North Bend can donate at least 4 items of food or \$4 for the South Coast Food Share and then drop off up to 4 cans (35-gallon size) of household garbage. Recyclables are welcome, but no tires, appliances, furniture, metal, or hazardous materials will be accepted. Garbage drop-off is limited to residents of Coos Bay & North Bend.

United Way Day of Caring will be helping out community members, such as elderly or disabled persons, by picking up garbage at their homes and bringing it to a drop-off site. South Coast Food Share, North Bend Presbyterian Church, and the Salvation Army will be helping to collect donations and direct traffic at the drop-off sites. Les' Sanitary Service, Coos Bay Sanitary service, and North Bend Sanitation will be accepting the garbage and providing the collection equipment.

Last year, we accepted over 19 tons of garbage and collected over 1,000 pounds of food for local food banks. This is our 10th year, so we hope to make this event even bigger and better than ever!



### ***Budget Committee Approves Next Year's Budgets***

The City of Coos Bay's Budget Committee met on April 13<sup>th</sup> and approved both the Urban Renewal Agency (Agency) and City budgets for fiscal year 2017 - 18. The next step in the process will be for both budgets to progress to a public hearing at a regularly scheduled Agency and City Council meeting on June 6, 2017. The budgets are one of the most important and informative documents city officials and the public will use. After adoption, the budgets and respective State documents will be completed and filed with the County and other interested parties (debtors, State of Oregon, Standard & Poors, etc.) to inform and impose the taxes to complete the public process budget. From that point, the staff will use the budgets to implement the City Council and Agency goals.

### ***Fire Department Annual Awards Banquet***

On Saturday, April 15<sup>th</sup>, the Coos Bay Volunteer Firefighter's Association held its annual awards banquet at the Oregon Coast Culinary Institute. This annual banquet provides an opportunity for the department to honor both active and retired firefighters. Roughly 100 people attended the event. Some of the highlights from this year's festivities included the recognition of Volunteer Firefighter Danielle Espinoza and Career Lieutenant Jason Guenther receiving awards for alarm response. Volunteer Firefighter Cody Carlson and Career Firefighter Luke Taylor received awards for completing the most hours of training in 2016. Carlson also took home the top award of Firefighter of the Year for his contribution to the Fire Department in 2016. There were 16 retirees at the banquet, including Chief Stan Gibson and Tony Virgili. Tony was the former Fire Chief of Empire and later a career firefighter for Coos Bay. He served the community for 40 years (1948 to 1988). The department is grateful to the men and women that give their time and energy to serve our community as firefighters. We have many reasons to celebrate and honor them and their families.

### Coos Bay Brush Pick-Up

May 1st



- **Brush must be out prior to May 1st.**
- **1 pile per address, no more than 5 feet in length.**
- **Brush should be next to curb, away from any overhead obstacles, fire hydrants, or other obstructions.**
- **No materials which are not appropriate for grinding.**  
No grass clippings, sod, dirt, loose leaves, plastic bags, baling twine, rope, or non-organic materials.
- **Pile must not exceed 5 cubic yards.** For larger piles, call Les' Sanitary or Coos Bay Sanitary to make arrangements to pick it up, cost is \$11.50 per cubic yard.



Items to put in your pile:

- ◊ Brush
- ◊ Leaves in paper bags
- ◊ Tree limbs
- ◊ Blackberry vines

**Brush pick-up is a great time to make sure your property complies with city code by keeping the streets and sidewalks clear and safe.**

Coos Bay Municipal Code 8.10.060 states:

- ◊ The abutting property owner is responsible for keeping streets and sidewalks clear.
- ◊ Trees and bushes must be trimmed so that any overhanging portions are at least eight (8) feet above the sidewalk and at least fourteen (14) feet above the roadway.
- ◊ Any dead or decaying tree must be removed if it is a hazard to the public or to persons or property on or near the property.
