

Coos Bay Will Soon Have a New Grocery Store!

The City's Planning Commission approved the development on Valentine's Day, and the site development is expected to begin this spring. The existing buildings on the block will be demolished, and the one-story grocery store measuring approximately 13,500 square feet will be built. The development will improve the pedestrian access and sidewalks in the area, provide 45 parking spaces, and develop the site with over 12% landscaping. Natural Grocers is based in Colorado, and it offers high-end grocery products at affordable prices. Overall, this development should provide a great new business in the downtown area for Coos Bay.



Natural Grocers is a business that has been in operation for more than sixty years. Philip and Margaret Isely founded the Vitamin Cottage that eventually became Natural Grocers in 1955. It began as a door-to-door business where different healthy products were sold to customers in the small town of Golden, Colorado. Additionally, Margaret and Phillip shared nutritional information with the people they encountered. They believed that people who possessed nutrition knowledge were more likely to purchase healthier foods. Within a short time, the door-to-door business became successful, and the first retail location was opened. Fast forward to today, there are nearly 140 stores spread across 19 states.

Coos Bay Fire Department Participates in Emergency Response Training.

The Oregon National Guard's 102nd Civil Support Team (CST) participated in an interagency training exercise with first responders in Coos Bay on Feb. 7-9, 2017.

Additional emergency response vehicles including resources from the Oregon National Guard were in the Coos Bay area over the three-day training period. The training exercises took place at SOMAR, which is located at 40 Ross Inlet Road and Coos Bay Fire Station No. 3, which is located at 365 D Street in Eastside.



The CST provides identification, analysis, and advisement on response measures to local incident commanders in the event of a natural or manmade hazardous incident. The CST is based in Salem, Oregon, and it is comprised of Soldiers and Airmen with highly-specialized training.



The three-day training event focused on the interoperability of CST, local first responders, and private facilities. The event is part of the United States Army North (USARNORTH) evaluation of the 102nd CST who will be supporting the Coos Bay Fire Department incident command. In addition to evaluating the CST's manning, equipment, training, and competency, the training exercise tests first responders' ability to react to a local emergency.

Recently, a large, wedge-shaped tornado struck Albany and Dougherty County Georgia. Hundreds of homes were severely damaged, and many roads were rendered unpassable due to trees and debris. Coos Bay Fire Department's Lieutenant John Guenther traveled to Albany, Georgia with Reach Out WorldWide (ROWW) to assist with clean up, chainsaw work, debris removal, and tarping of homes hardest hit by the tornado. Lt. Guenther is part of a dedicated team of first responders who volunteer with the ROWW that provides disaster relief domestically and internationally. Lt.

Guenther has deployed with ROWW previously to South Carolina to help with flood mitigation. With each deployment, he brings back skills and expertise that benefit the community and department.

Are you interested in serving on the Coos County Tourism Workgroup?

The Coos County Tourism Workgroup, a newly formed non-profit organization formed under a joint agreement between Coos County and Bandon Dunes Golf Resort, is seeking interested citizens wishing to serve on the Board of Directors. The purpose of the Board is to govern the Coos County Tourism non-profit and oversee activities aimed at achieving the organizational goal to invest in strengthening tourism in the South Coast's evolving economy.

The initial nine-member Board will be appointed by the Coos County Commissioners. The Board will consist of: one (1) County representative; two (2) Bandon Dunes representatives; four (4) Geographic representatives; and two (2) At Large representatives.

Required qualifications included: experience in the tourism industry; be connected with tourism partners and or projects in Coos County; be collaborative and regional-minded; be willing and able to put the need of the Coos County first; have enthusiasm and time to fully participate; and abide by a code of conduct approved by the Board. In addition, all



Geographic Representative Directors are required to live or work in Coos County.

Persons interested in serving on the Board of the Coos County Tourism Workgroup are encouraged to submit a letter of interest to Connie Stopher, SCDC Executive Director by email (connie@scdcinc.org) prior to February 22, 2017. Letters of interest should include the position being sought (at-large or geographic areas) and your qualifications. It is anticipated that applicants will be interviewed on February 27, 2017.
