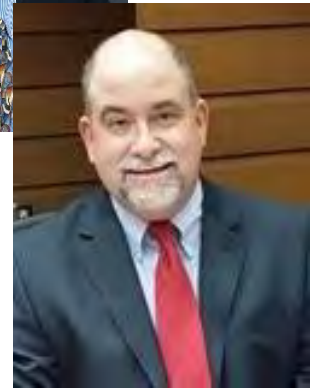
In appreciation for their service...

Jeff Adkins appointed as Battalion Chief...

The Coos Bay Fire Department has selected Jeff Adkins to fill the vacant Battalion Chief position. A Battalion Chief is a management level position responsible for the operations of one of the three shifts. Battalion Chiefs serve as the administrator of program areas or divisions within the department. Jeff will be taking over the responsibilities as the Training Officer for the department, the Emergency Medical Services program, Personal Protective Equipment maintenance program, and as well as several other program areas. The position was vacated with the retirement of Battalion Chief Dean Martin at the end of September.



Battalion Chief Jeff Adkins began his career with the City of Coos Bay Fire Department in December 2006. Prior to being hired with Coos Bay, he was a volunteer firefighter and EMT with Coquille Fire and Ambulance. During his career with Coos Bay, Jeff has been a part of many aspects of the department; most notably as the coordinator for the Regional Hazardous Materials Team. Adkins was promoted from Firefighter/Engineer to the rank of Lieutenant in 2014. For the past seven years, Battalion Chief Adkins has held the office of treasurer for both the Coos Bay Volunteer Firefighter's Association and for the Coos Bay Professional Firefighter's Local 2935.

Battalion Chief Adkins holds an Associate's degree in Fire Science from Southwestern Oregon Community College, and a Bachelor's degree in Fire Administration from Waldorf College. Battalion Chief Adkins is an EMT-Intermediate, and he has achieved Firefighter II, Fire Officer IV, Fire Instructor II and Hazardous Materials Technician through the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training.

Jeff has been married to his wife Lisa for over 21 years and together they have two daughters and two granddaughters.

Dan Henthorn sworn in as Police Officer...

After a lengthy hiring process, the Coos Bay Police Department has selected Officer Dan Henthorn to fill the vacancy created by the resignation of Officer Mark Ereth.



Officer Henthorn comes from the Coquille Police Department where he worked as a police officer for the last seven years. He is certified as a police officer through the Department of Public Safety Standards and Training. While with the Coquille Police Department, Officer Henthorn served as a Field Training Officer as well as a Taser Instructor. He was a member of the Interagency Evidence Collection Team and Major Crimes Investigation Team.
