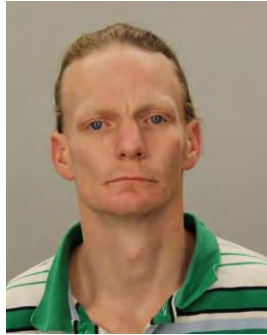
EGYPTIAN THEATRE FEATURED IN NATIONWIDE NEWSPAPER

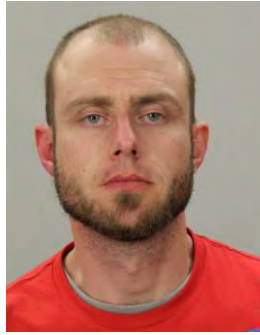


SOME RECENT HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT:

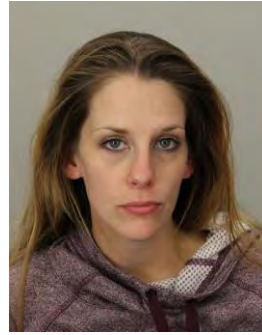
This past Sunday, October 25th officers stopped a 1989 Nissan operated by 36 year old James M. Wenzell. Also, in the vehicle with Mr. Wenzell were 30 year old Cassie Littles and 33 year old Jacob Burch. Mr. Wenzell, who has a suspended driver's license, was taken into custody for Driving While Suspended (misdemeanor) and a Probation Violation. Burch was arrested for a Probation Violation and Littles, who initially gave a false name to officers, was eventually identified and subsequently arrested for two active warrants for her arrest. Additionally, officers located a stolen firearm concealed in Little's waist band. She was charged with Unlawful Possession of a Firearm.

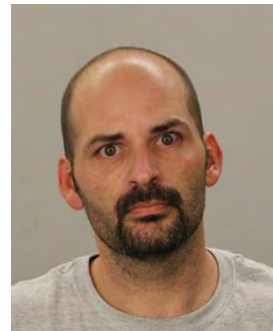

This past Thursday officers responded to Wal-Mart after store security reported a suspect from a recent Identity Theft and Fraud case was back inside the store. Officers located the suspect, 34 year-old Christopher A. Henderson, who was attempting to purchase electronics with a forged temporary driver's license and a stolen check. Officers found that Henderson had numerous stolen checks and several other forged temporary drivers' licenses in his possession.



Henderson was taken into custody and officers began a lengthy investigation to identify any and all of the victims that Henderson had defrauded and/or stolen their identity. During the course of their investigation, officers identified another suspect associated with the case, 26 year-old Andrew D. Gray.



Although the investigation is ongoing, officers have identified numerous victims of Identity Theft and Fraud from the local area. Many of these victims recently reported thefts from vehicle break-ins.

Both Mr. Henderson and Mr. Gray have been charged with multiple crimes. Other charges may follow as the investigation continues.

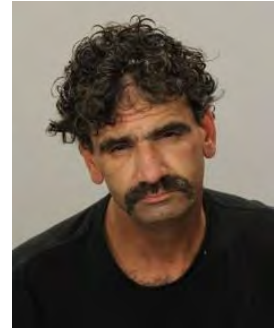

MORE RECENT HIGHLIGHTS FROM THE POLICE DEPARTMENT :

Yesterday during the early morning hours, officers responded to a business alarm at Far West Tires. When officers arrived, they observed a hole cut in the fence of the business's storage compound. As officers began their check of the area, they located a male suspect hiding in some brush just outside of the compound. During their investigation, officers located evidence that indicated the male identified as 53 year old Coos Bay resident Malio Favalora, a career criminal. He had entered the compound, and he was in the process of stealing items when officers arrived. Mr. Favalora was taken into custody for Burglary II, Theft I, and Criminal Mischief II.
